Marianapolis Preparatory School offers a rigorous college-preparatory curriculum supported by Honors and Advanced Placement courses across core disciplines. Students may pursue one of four interdisciplinary Centers of Excellence that combine coursework with practicum experiences and a senior capstone project. Faculty emphasize critical thinking, research, and communication, with close academic advising throughout the year. The curriculum is structured to prepare students for selective universities, with strong outcomes in STEM, business, and the humanities. Small class sizes support individualized instruction, while experiential learning programs extend academic study beyond the classroom through applied projects, travel, and community engagement.

The Marianapolis campus is set on expansive wooded grounds in northeastern Connecticut. Academic spaces support collaborative learning, laboratory science, engineering design, and digital innovation. Outdoor areas are used for experiential learning, fitness, and community activities, reinforcing a balanced academic and residential experience.

Residential Life

The boarding community includes students from the United States and multiple international regions, creating a globally diverse living environment.

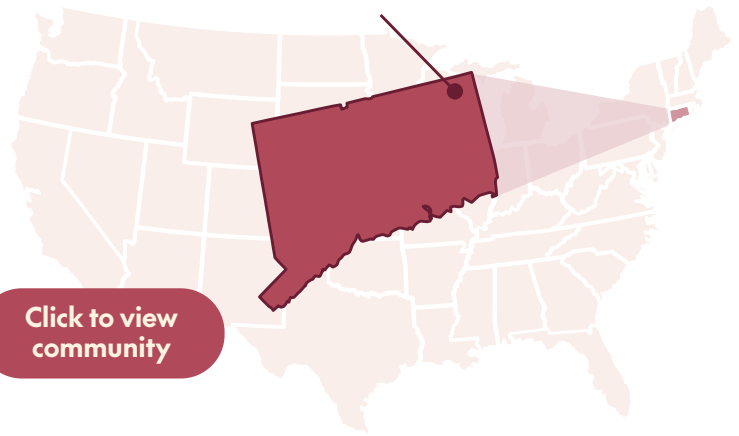
