Boarding at Kensington Park School

Princess Beatrice House, the school's boarding house, is well-known for its tasteful decor and furnishings coupled with a unique central London location, making it one of the best places to board in the UK. The house is carefully managed 24 hours a day, and professional boarding staff work alongside the school academic team to ensure that every student is nurtured and supported. The excellent pastoral team oversee daily registrations, house meetings, and strict curfews to ensure that students have the right balance between enjoying London and staying safe.

All rooms have en-suite bathrooms and kitchenettes which supplement the outstanding catering provision. The in-house catering team provide two meals a day with a variety of cuisines, and the dining room is a bright, open and sociable space for students to eat, relax, build friendships with fellow boarders, and study together or independently. The common room is another comfortable space for students to spend time with each other, take part in film nights, house activities and experience the unique offering that boarding can provide.



SCIENCE AT KENSINGTON PARK SCHOOL

Science plays an important role in life at Kensington Park School, and students are encouraged to explore STEM subjects both in and outside the classroom. KPS students regularly enter competitions such as the Cambridge Chemistry Challenge, the Schools Science Competition, and the UK Maths Challenge, while the popular SciArt club explores the cross-section between science and art. During Science Week, all faculties approach the term's topics from a scientific angle to expand students' understanding of science, its relevance, and many applications in the world today. Our modern facilities allow students at the Lower School and Sixth Form to learn in a dynamic environment which prepares them for studying at university and beyond.

OUTSTANDING NEW HOUSE SYSTEM

Students at Kensington Park School are sorted into one of four Houses: Effra, Fleet, Tyburn or Walbrook. The House system is a platform for pastoral support and encourages students to work across year groups, enabling tighter communities to form within the school and challenging students in areas outside of their comfort zones. As well as team- based activities during House meetings, the Houses compete in sporting, creative and academic competitions to secure House points and trophies.

EXCELLENT PROGRESSION

In addition to outstanding A Level results, KPS students secure offers from leading universities in the UK and beyond to study a broad range of subjects. In 2021, KPS students accepted places at universities such as Oxford, Cambridge, Durham, UCL, Bristol, Warwick, Imperial, and Boston (USA) for courses including Engineering, Chemistry, Languages, Economics, Maths and International Business.
