Campus Facilities

The 42-acre campus blends natural surroundings with modern learning spaces. Facilities include **updated classrooms, arts studios, a digital filmmaking lab, photography and design spaces, athletic fields, and areas for outdoor learning around the central pond.** Students have access to technology and flexible environments that support collaboration, creativity, and project-based learning.

Residential Life

Boarding students live in supervised dormitories with **shared rooms, common lounges, and study areas.** The residential community includes students from across the United States and abroad, creating a **supportive environment** that encourages independence and social connection. Weekends feature structured activities, local trips, and school events that build community engagement.

Athletics and Arts

Athletics at CH-CH emphasize participation, fitness, and teamwork. Students compete in interscholastic leagues across seasonal sports and benefit from access to fields, courts, and training spaces.

The arts program supports creativity through visual arts, theater, photography, digital media, musical performance, and sculpture. Students use well-equipped studios and production spaces and participate in performances, exhibitions, and media projects throughout the year.

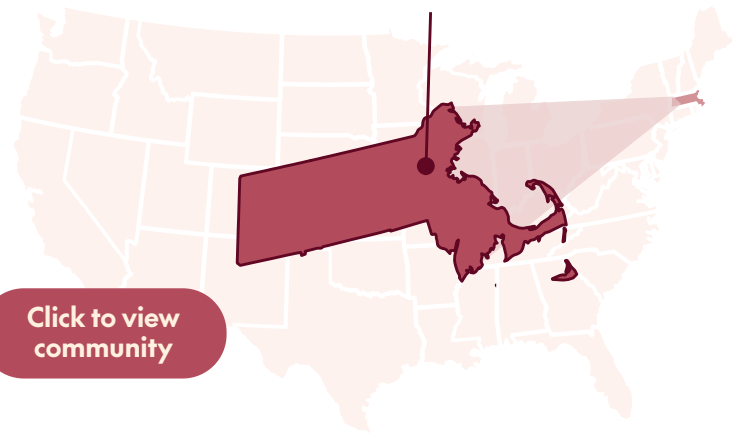
