MCI's 50-acre campus in Pittsfield features **modern** academic, residential, and athletic facilities. The Chuck and Helen Cianchette Math and Science Center includes advanced laboratories, while the William H. Powell Memorial Library offers extensive academic resources. The campus also houses the Parks and Wright Gymnasiums, multiple residence halls, and a student center for dining and recreation.

Pittsfield is a welcoming small town in central Maine with a population of about 3,900. The community offers a safe, supportive environment surrounded by nature. Bangor, the nearest major city, is 50 miles away and home to Bangor International Airport (BGR). Local attractions include the **Pittsfield**Community Theatre and the Central Maine Egg Festival.

Climate in Pittsfield, Maine

Pittsfield experiences a humid continental climate, characterized by warm summers and snowy winters. Average high temperatures range from $25^{\circ}F$ ($-4^{\circ}C$) in January to $80^{\circ}F$ ($27^{\circ}C$) in July. The area receives about 42 inches (1,070 mm) of precipitation annually, with January typically being the snowiest month.
