Adrian High School provides multiple academic pathways designed to prepare students for university study and career readiness. Students in Grades 11–12 may pursue the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme, while others can choose Advanced Placement courses and dual enrollment options with local colleges. Honors courses are available across core subjects. The school reports a graduation rate above the state average and a 100% university acceptance rate for graduating seniors. Faculty support is structured through counseling, graduation coaches, and English language assistance for international students, ensuring academic progression and postsecondary planning support.

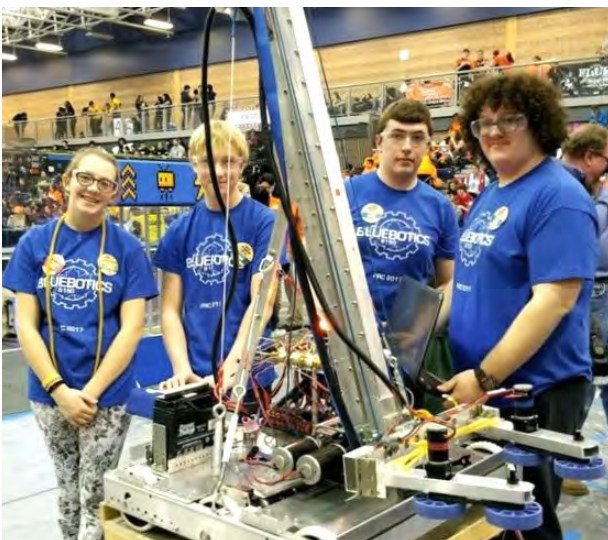
Campus Facilities

The campus includes updated academic classrooms, science laboratories, a central library, and dedicated spaces for visual and performing arts. Fine arts facilities support ceramics, digital media, photography, theater, choir, orchestra, and band. Athletic infrastructure includes a full-size gymnasium, outdoor athletic fields, a track facility, tennis courts, and a weight training area. Recent community-funded upgrades have focused on technology, safety, and athletic spaces to support both academic and extracurricular programs.

Athletics and Arts

Athletics are a core component of student life, with participation across fall, winter, and spring seasons. Teams compete at the regional and state levels, and student-athletes are supported through structured strength and conditioning programs.

More than half of the student body participates in fine and performing arts. Programs include band, choir, orchestra, theater, dance, and a wide range of visual arts courses, many of which support portfolio development and performance-based learning.

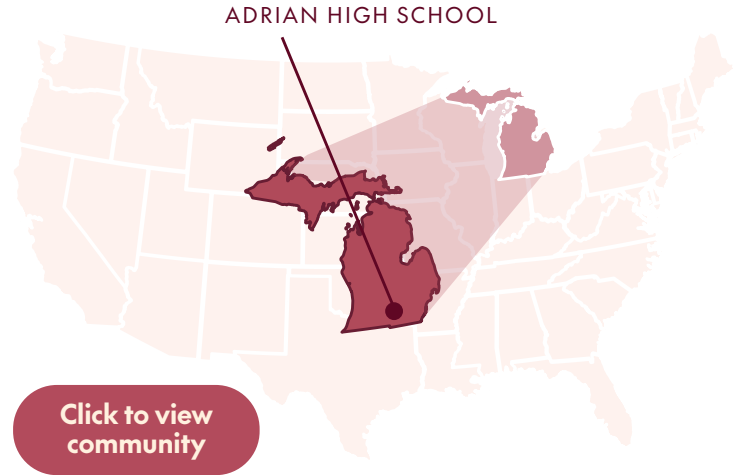
