AWARDS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

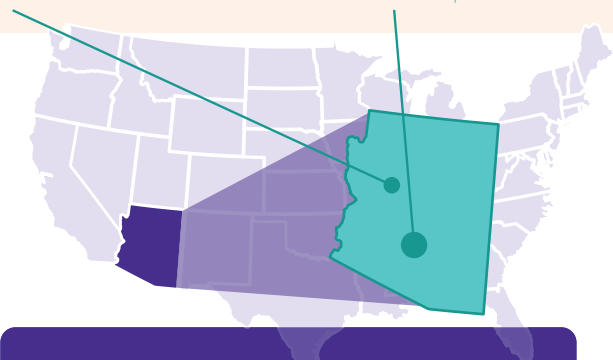
