## Campus Facilities

Schools in the Boise School District invest heavily in academic and athletic facilities. From well-equipped science laboratories and comprehensive libraries to dedicated art studios and athletic complexes, the infrastructure supports a wide range of academic and extracurricular activities. One campus includes four gymnasiums, with one of the largest seating capacities among high schools in Idaho. Additional facilities include two weight rooms, a fully padded wrestling room, a sports medicine center, and outdoor athletic complexes with soccer fields, softball fields, baseball facilities, and an eight-lane all-weather running track. These campuses also feature art studios and modern classrooms designed to support academic learning, visual arts instruction, and extracurricular programs.

## Athletics and Arts

Recognizing the importance of holistic development, the Boise School District offers extensive programs in the arts and athletics. Athletics are an important part of student life in Boise School District, with opportunities for participation in multiple seasonal sports programs. Teams compete in regional leagues and provide opportunities for both recreational participation and competitive play. Programs emphasize physical fitness, teamwork, and school spirit while supporting student academic commitments.

Arts programs provide opportunities for students to explore visual arts and creative expression through studio courses and performance opportunities. 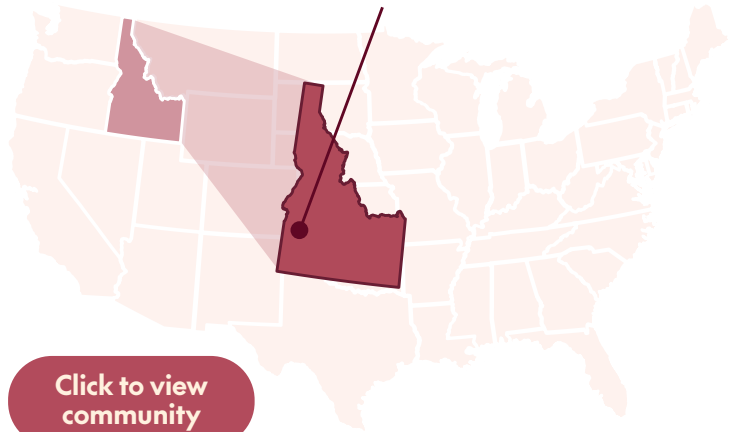
